NEW BUSINESS

SAND EXTRACTION DISCUSSION

The Planning Commissioners reviewed <u>Article III Section III-D ee. Mining or quarrying</u> <u>sand and gravel extraction</u> in the Maize Unified Zoning Code. The following changes are recommended to the conditions:

(6) The *operator* of the property shall be responsible for minimizing blowing dust from the site.

(16) Hours of operation for the removal of overburden shall be limited to 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. or sunset, whichever comes first Monday through Friday; 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, Saturday.

(24) The sand extraction operation shall be located no closer than 300 feet to any residence other than the residence of the owner of the land upon which the operation is to be located *and 200 feet from all property lines.*

(25) Issuance of the Conditional Use shall be subject to *a 6 month* review by the Planning Administrator.

Motion carried unanimously.
